

Automobiles and Dealerships of the Past and the Modern Era

On 19 January 1978 - 44 years ago today, the last Beetle built at Volkswagenwerk Emden, and the last Beetle sedan to be built in Germany, rolled from the production line.

Painted in Dakota Beige, it was also the last of 16,255,500 Beetle sedans to be made in Germany and was shipped to the Stiftung Auto Museum Volkswagen in Wolfsburg.

Beetle production at Emden began on 8 December 1964 and continued for thirteen years with a total of 2,362,800 produced at the factory.



Back in the day automotive plant tours, like this one at GM's Pontiac Assembly, gave visitors an up close and personal look at how automobiles were built.



INFORMATION ON RED CLUB PLATES

A short review of use of registered red club plates— for full details follow the web address at the end of the page

Club Registration Scheme is designed to provide for concessional registration of eligible enthusiast vehicles.

The scheme is intended to support and encourage Northern Territory motor vehicle enthusiasts to maintain the operational status of historic and individually constructed vehicles and allow them to have restricted access to a road or road related area at a reduced rate of registration and compulsory third party insurance. Club Registration is not an alternative to normal vehicle registration and it is not a short-term registration scheme. This document recognises the limited road use of specific types of vehicle, which includes vehicles with a manufactured build date of over 30 years.

Limited road use under the Club Registration Scheme is intended to assist the owner in maintaining the vehicle in a roadworthy condition for participation in "Approved" Club events such as vehicle displays to the general public and club organised functions.

There are two specific types of use applicable to vehicles with Club Registration.

- 1. Approved Club Events, including events organised by other clubs or organisations which are supported and approved by the Club.
- 2. Maintenance, Test Driving or Restricted Personal Use. Vehicles registered under the Club Registration Scheme are registered for 12 month period only.

A condition of the scheme is that a 'Log book' must be filled out to record each and every journey undertaken by the vehicle.

Use of vehicle is restricted to 60 days - for Approved Club Events and 30 days - for maintenance, test driving/restricted personal use So total of 90 days

Interstate travel is permitted on programmed Club events or when the Club, or a Club member, receives a written invitation to attend an event from the organisers of a formal interstate Club event - application must be made to Club Committee for the event.

- The Club committee is required to advise the Registrar of Motor Vehicles, in writing, that members of the club intend to participate in an interstate event.
- This advice should be received by the Registrar at least one month prior to the start of the event. The written advice should include the registration number of the club registered vehicle/s intending to travel interstate, the departure and return dates of the vehicles, full contact details of the organisers of the event and a copy of the formal invitation or documentation associated with the event

Vehicles registered under the Club Registration Scheme have not paid full registration fees, and as such, are not entitled to full and unrestricted road use.

Overlander Badge History & Particulars

The members of the Alice Springs Vintage & Veteran Car Club originally created this very special and much sought after award in the mid 1970s in recognition of the many Veteran, Vintage and Classic motor vehicles whose drivers took up the challenge to travel from interstate to visit Alice Springs. Back in those days the roads to Alice were not the wide, smooth roads we have today but were narrow, undulating strips of bitumen with rough shoulders and causeways where we now have all weather bridges. The Stuart Highway from Port Augusta to the Northern Territory border was still a rough boulder strewn, bull dust and corrugated dirt track which tested the endurance of man and his machine. The sealing of this part of the Stuart Highway was not completed until 1987. The award was appropriately named the OVERLANDER BADGE to commemorate the vast distances covered on these roads, the confidence or blind faith the owners had in their vehicles, and the courage of the drivers and passengers who travelled in them to reach Alice Springs. In July 1996 when the Motor Enthusiasts Club of Central Australia was formed and incorporated the Alice Springs Vintage & Veteran Car Club it was decided that a new category be established to award vehicles from 1947 to a rolling date of 30 years old that make the journey to Alice Springs. This is called the Special Interest category.

Today the **OVERLANDER BADGE** is available to anyone who is confident enough to take up the challenge to drive their Veteran, Vintage, Classic or Special Interest vehicle or motor cycle either to or from Alice Springs over an approved distance. The Badge can only be awarded to the nominated driver and vehicle which must arrive at or depart from Alice Springs and cover the specified distance under the vehicles own power.

THE APPROVED DISTANCES FOR THE FOUR CATEGORIES ARE:

Veteran:Up to 1919500 kilometresVintage:1920 to 19301500 kilometresClassic:1931 to 19463000 kilometresSpecial Interest:1947 to 30 years old3000 kilometres

The badges differ in design to distinguish the different categories:

Veteran Badge:White tyre, red spokes, silver grey background and yellow scroll.Vintage Badge:Black tyre, green spokes. Silver grey background and yellow scroll.Classic:Black tyre, orange spokes. Silver grey background and yellow scroll.Special Interest:Black tyre, blue spokes. Silver grey background and yellow scroll.

TO APPLY for the badge, contact your club secretary, or apply directly to the MECCA Club secretary. An application form will be sent to you or your club secretary, as required. This form is self-explanatory and must be returned to the MECCA club secretary on completion of the road kilometre requirements. Fee for the badge and engraving is \$75.00. We recommend payment in advance, ie., upon application, to ensure engraving is completed in time for presentation at the completion of your trip.

ALL APPLICANTS, whether arriving from interstate or originating in Alice Springs, must submit reasonable proof of their completion of the qualifying road kilometres in order to be awarded the Overland Badge. This is typically in the form of fuel receipts from the service stations along the route.

AFTER APPROVAL by the Overlander Badge committee, the badge applicable to your vehicle will be duly inscribed with the applicants name and vehicle and registered in our files. The badge will then be posted to you or your club secretary's postal address, as specified. If you have completed your required kilometres upon arrival in Alice Springs, MECCA can present the badge to the applicant in person.
